GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT



SALV CARMUSCIANO General Manager

IT WAS A RECORD-BREAKING YEAR FOR FOOTBALL IN MACARTHUR, WITH 10,801 PLAYERS ACROSS 917 TEAMS TAKING THE FIELD IN 2021 – THE MOST IN THE HISTORY OF THE MACARTHUR FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION.

Despite facing the challenges of a global health pandemic over the past two seasons, Football in Macarthur is in great shape. Much of this should be credited to the member clubs and the thousands of volunteers that serve the football community. Macarthur is lucky to be home to more quality clubs than any other region across NSW, with eleven clubs scoring three or more stars after completing the National Club Development Program.

We cannot thank the driving force behind our clubs enough for the countless hours they give to our game and our community. The game is lucky to have you and is nothing without you.

Whilst the 2021 season was interrupted, there was still plenty to celebrate in the region.

1. THE GIRLS GAME CONTINUES ITS TRAJECTORY

A record 2,264 female players across 119 teams enjoyed the World Game in 2021. Pleasingly, much of the growth in female participation is coming in the MiniRoos, with 50 Girls-only teams competing this season, an increase of almost 50% on 2020.

The acquisition of respected football administrator Hayley Todd to the Board of the MFA this year should not be underestimated. As General Manager, I welcome Hayley's appointment and am excited to have her 'onside' as the MFA strives to improve the game for women and girls and grow the game.

2. LAUNCH OF THE MACARTHUR 'SAP' LEAGUE

Born out of the 2020 review into Representative Football and Coach Development, the simple goal of the new Macarthur SAP League is to improve development opportunities for more players and coaches within the local clubs of Macarthur. This initiative aligns to the following MFA S trategic Objectives:



- Enhance the Participation Experience
- Raise Standards of Youth Football
- Provide a quality youth development environment

Ten clubs took part in the inaugural development League in 2021, which commenced as a pilot for the U8 and will expand to the U9 in 2022. The' M-SAP League' acts as the top tier of local football for the key development age groups and aims to give the region's most promising young players the best opportunity to transition into the NPL environment and enhance their chances of a potential professional career.

3. MACARTHUR FC JOIN THE A-LEAGUE

2021 saw new A-League franchise Macarthur FC not only join the professional competition but fall just one win short of a Grand Final debut.

Community engagement is an important value for the Bulls and the MFA enjoys a fantastic working relationship with the club as together we aim to add value to the Football Family and build a passionate supporter base for Macarthur FC. Highlights of our first season together include:

- Players attending MFA events, including inaugural Captain and former Socceroo Mark Milligan. 'Millsy' was kind enough to find time in the middle of the A-League season to attend the 2021 M-League Season launch and speak about his playing career.
- Collaboration in the planning and delivery of School Holiday Programs.
- Coach development sessions delivered by Bulls coaching staff.
- School programs delivered by Macarthur FC through the Bulls in School Program.
- Access to a corporate box for all thirteen home games, which was enjoyed by volunteers and sponsors from all member clubs.
- Match day opportunities for local players and coaches, including participation in the half-time hero's program and a march past initiative which saw over 1,000 players and coaches from MFA member clubs welcomed onto Campbelltown Stadium during halftime of the round 23 fixture.

The MFA extends our congratulations to the Bulls on a successful first season in the A-League and looks forward to a strong relationship with the professional club in the future.

The MFA is in the beginning of a very clear five-year plan with some ambitious targets on the agenda and whilst we have experienced a couple of interrupted community football seasons, we continue to make strides towards improving our game. People and partnerships are the keys to our future success as a code, and to that end, we would like to extend our appreciation to the following:

- The local Councils of Wollondilly, Camden, and Campbelltown. Thank you for recognising the love your communities have for our game and continuing the investment in our local facilities.
- The Association and local club sponsors. In what has been a very challenging period for businesses, we cannot thank you enough for your continued support of our game.
- To the Macarthur District Football Referees Association and all the referees that service the game. Thank you for always giving your best with the whistle in hand.
- To the staff at the MFA. You're a great group of people to work with. Your commitment to the game and those that serve it shouldn't be underestimated. Thank you for delivering such exceptional customer service.
- To the many volunteers that support the running of the MFA on various committees. There are no words that can really express the gratitude and respect we have for you. Thank you for giving so much of yourselves to the game.
- Lastly, to all the Directors of the MFA Board. No one can ever question your passion for the game and for the Football Family. Every decision is always with what is best for the Football Community at the forefront. Simply a great group of people and an honour to serve with.

On a personal note, I genuinely feel for the Football Family following the premature end to the 2021 season. We witnessed some breathtaking football early on and it is such a shame we could not conclude the year. More importantly though, we must acknowledge the seriousness of the pandemic, which brought NSW to a standstill and saw many lives lost. The MFA extends its best wishes to the Football Family and hope that everyone continues to keep safe during these unprecedented times. We look forward to 2022 with optimism.

STEVE CARROLL Competitions Manager

THE 2021 SEASON PROMISED SO MUCH BUT ULTIMATELY DID NOT GET PAST THE MID-WAY POINT DUE TO THE COVID-19 SHUT DOWN.

With only half a season of matches played, and no final series being held, we can only speculate on what may have been.

What we do know is that we had a total of nine teams through to the quarter finals of the State Cup and all had a great chance to progress further, but that was not to be with the remaining rounds of the State Cup cancelled.

We also know that we had our greatest participation numbers with over 10,800 player registrations for 2021. This was a significant outcome given the disrupted 2020 season which brought with it the concern that people might walk away form the sport. But when you have a great product, run by great clubs, a threat to player numbers can and was overcome. The test will be holding and growing these numbers as we advance into season 2022, which I'm sure, for the same reason numbers were up this year, we can anticipate another strong support of football in Macarthur.

Whilst a full summary of player numbers and other salient analysis can be seen elsewhere in this report, we do highlight the following: Overall player numbers increased approximately 11% to 10,801 (from 9,679) and across the three categories of football we saw:

MiniRoos:	4,730 (+478) registrations
Juniors:	2,796 (+243) registrations
Seniors:	3,275 (+493) registrations
Female Players:	2,264 (+377), being 21% of total registered players. This percentage against overall numbers was pleasingly up on the 19% 2020 figure.
Total number of teams:	917, up a staggering 107 teams on 2020 team numbers.
Female Teams:	119 teams or over 19% of total team numbers.

2021 saw the introduction of the 'M-SAP League' for players in the Under 8 age group. The League was offered through 10 Clubs providing a solid foundation for this new MFA initiative. Players and parents were very supportive of this initiative and the improving skill set of all children involved was evident. Congratulations to all in providing a positive football experience for all involved.

As a result of the success of the U8 M-SAP in 2021, the program has been extended to both U8 and U9 age groups in 2022 and we look forward to witnessing further growth and development of the players involved.

A big shout out to all Clubs, their volunteers, players and coaches, and the referees for all their support in 2021, and we look forward to a fresh start in 2022 which will hopefully see a full season of football played.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

Coaching Courses

Although the 2021 Macarthur Football Association season was heavily affected by the NSW lockdown, coach education and development showed no signs of slowing down with course engagement hitting a new record.

Over the 2021 season, Macarthur Football Association hosted various coaching education opportunities which included MiniRoos Certificates, Skill Training Certificates, Game Training Certificates, and Club Coach Coordinator workshops.

With more than 170 individuals successfully completing their training through one or more of these educational opportunities, the MFA are confident that community coaches are being supported with the relevant tools to help develop the next generation of footballers across the association.

MiniRoos Certificates

The MiniRoos Certificate was the most sought-after coaching course throughout the 2021 season with 105 participants completing the certificate, which is designed for new and inexperienced coaches looking for ideas and support when it comes to coaching.

The course helps coaches develop sessions with a structure based around FUN for our U6-U8 footballers.

From a total of 7 courses held, a special mention should go out to Camden Falcons, Eschol Park FC, Picton Rangers and St Marys FC for hosting MiniRoos Certificates and providing valuable upskilling opportunities for their MiniRoos coaches. Tahmoor Soccer Club also deserves special mention as Club Coach Coordinator Alex Sargent continues to deliver in-house MiniRoos Certificates for Tahmoor coaches.

Another point of particular success was the first Female Only MiniRoos Certificate that was held at Lynwood Park in March of 2021. 20 young ladies from the MFA and the Macarthur Rams Women FC completed their first step towards a coaching pathway under the guidance and support of Macarthur Rams Women Youth coach Samantha McGowan.

Skill & Game Training Certificates

The 2021 season saw 48 coaches complete their Skill Training Certificate and 16 coaches complete their Game Training Certificate in the region.

The introduction of the M-SAP League helped this increase in participation as coaches involved in the program were required to have a minimum Skill Training qualification and were supported by MFA through a subsidised registration cost.

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Once again, special mention goes out to Mt Annan, Picton Rangers and Camden Tigers who hosted Skill Training Certificates at their home grounds. Special mention should also be given to Camden Tigers who hosted the first ever Female Only Skill Training Certificate at Ron Dine Memorial Reserve with 8 female coaches continuing their development through the coach education ranks.

In collaboration with Picton Rangers FC Club Coach Coordinator Andrew Merchant, MFA was also able to deliver a combined Skill & Game Training Certificate that was well received by the attendees who walked away with even more knowledge than usual due to the combined nature of the course.

Club Coach Coordinator Program

Building on from the foundation under Norm Boardman's tenure, 2021 saw the Club Coach Coordinator (CCC) program continue to build a network of support for grassroots coaches at the local club level.

3 CCC Workshops were held during the season, including one that was held online. It is evident through this program that there are numerous dedicated and passionate people in the MFA community who are ready to support and mentor others through their own experience and knowledge and by sharing the resources and opportunities that MFA provide.

As we move into the 2022 season, the MFA will be looking for clubs to continue to buy into the Coach Development philosophy and continue building the network of support for all coaches in the community and ultimately improve the experience of all players.

The Coach Education Team & Sport Session Planner

The 2021 season saw courses presented by a team of coaches with the likes of Rod Henderson (MFA SAP Technical Director), Troy Spink (2021 Rams Women Technical Director), Pete Nowakowski (Rams Women Reserve Grade Coach), Sam McGowan (Rams Women Youth Coach) and Justin Mickan (Rams Men Youth Coach) delivering and assisting with coach education courses and club visits throughout the year.

This list of Coach Developers will continue to grow as Paul Bertolissio (Rams Men Head of Football) and Julia Chernoukha (Camden Tigers Girls/Women Technical Director) join the team and begin their journey as coach educators and share their valuable knowledge and experience with the MFA community.

Sport Session Planner (SSP) is a digital coaching platform that MFA has invested in, with the aim of providing further development tools to coaches within the region.

The MFA has invested in 85 coach subscriptions with key influencers being identified within the representative environments of MFA SAP & AYL, Macarthur Rams Men

and Women, and Camden Tigers. This initiative aims to further support all coaches across the region and bridge the gap between grassroots and representative football practises.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Holiday Clinics

The MFA partnered with A-League newcomers Macarthur FC to deliver Holiday Clinics prior to the COVID lockdown.

Clinics were held at Wayne Gardner Oval and Lynwood Park and saw a total of 339 participants register to the Autumn and Winter holiday clinics, with 138 kids signing up to the first clinics in April.

Unfortunately, the NSW lockdown prohibited the Winter holiday clinics from going ahead, however the registration numbers were extremely promising. We were particularly excited to have 55 girls registered to the first ever Girls Only Holiday Clinic and are positive that we can achieve this engagement again in 2022.

The benefits of collaborating with Macarthur FC Bulls was evident with all participants receiving a Macarthur FC training kit, Macarthur FC posters and the unique opportunity to meet Macarthur FC players like Lachie Rose and Michael Ruhs.

Association Development Program (ADP)

The ADP this year continued its long term success with 189 participants registering to the program that was delivered across 4 locations in the MFA.

The coaching team were spread out around Lynwood Park (St Helens Park), Belgenny Reserve (Camden), Blinman Oval (Glenfield) and Nugget Beames Reserve (Narellan Vale) on Monday and Friday nights to provide flexibility in the options for children to access our structured program delivered by qualified coaches.

Although the season was cut short, we were able to provide 11 weeks of training that included 2 Games Nights that brought all the participants together to play small-sided matches against each other in a gala-day format, and mid-program development reports for the players which provided information about their strengths and opportunities for improvement. We hope that the program and the unique opportunities for development will continue to aid the transition of grassroots players into the local M-SAP League and SAP teams.

At the time of writing this report, the MFA are planning the return to play for the ADP to finish off the program in 2021.

MARKETING SNAPSHOT

THE MACARTHUR FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION AIMS TO PROMOTE AND CELEBRATE OUR GAME TO ENGAGE MORE PEOPLE THAN ANY OTHER CODE.

Growing the Girls Game is a primary focus for the Association, and in 2021 we saw more female players than ever before. The Girls-only MiniRoos Leagues, introduced in 2019 as a key strategy to attracting and retaining young girls, grew from 28 teams in 2020 to 50 teams in 2021.

Football NSW again supported Associations via the annual 'Play Football' marketing campaign, with a focus on promoting via digital and social platforms. The campaign was primarily targeted at encouraging existing members to return for season 2021.

Once the season began the focus shifted to creating engaging content that celebrated the weekly participation of the Macarthur community in our game. The Association continued to focus on MiniRoos with our 'Showreel' and 'Team Talk' segments again proving to be popular content on Facebook and Instagram.

The Ottimo House M-League again took centre stage as Macarthur's premier competitions. Professional film crew Jum Media returned in 2021 to continue its exceptional coverage of both the Men's and Women's First Grade, with two matches per week live streamed.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales and Class Order 11/01. In the opinion of the Management Group the association is not a reporting entity because it is not reasonable to expect the existence of users who rely on the association's general purpose financial statements for information useful to them for making and evaluating decisions about the allocation of resources. The association has not assessed whether these special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Accounts Receivables and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members and customers for goods sold and services performed in the ordinary course of operations. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

PPE are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Income Tax

The Management Group are of the opinion that the Association is exempt from Income Tax under the provisions of Section 50.45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 and consequently no provision for taxation has been raised in the financial statements.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less."

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Interest revenue is recognised when received.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the Association obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt. Where the terms of the Grant or donation prescribe specific performance obligations, income is recognised when the performance obligations are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable.

(h) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability and is subject to normal credit terms (30-60 days). The balance is not interest-bearing."

The U13/4 & U17/2 were sitting in a fantastic place to make the final series, with a good chance of obtaining the Premiers or Champions titles. Disappointing that the season ended as it did for these two fantastic teams.

In November 2020, we successfully received a grant for \$15,000 from the Community Building Partnership Grant. This funding was used to fence the U6 & U7 fields down the bottom of the hill.

In May 2021, the club were successful in obtaining a grant for \$8,000 from the Stronger Communities Programme-Hume. The U8/9 & U10/11 goal posts were in desperate need of replacement. This funding was allocated to replacing the goal posts and the purchase of nets for these fields. A working bee over the Easter long weekend saw the install of the posts.

The committee used the lockdown to get busy with the National Club Development Program application. The club initially held a 2-star rating. Using the feedback received from MFA, the club managed to work up to an outstanding 4-star rating.

The grant funded the building of a new awning to improve outdoor shelter for our players and spectators. During COVID lockdown, we took advantage of the down time to complete the project. Greg Little, Secretary from Camden Cricket Club said they will also benefit from the awning extension in the summer months.
