GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

AFTER A DISAPPOINTING END TO THE 2021 SEASON, IT WAS PLEASING TO WELCOME BACK OVER 10,000 REGISTERED PLAYERS ACROSS OUR CLUBS THIS YEAR.

As a code, our aim in 2022 was simple – support the safe participation in football for as many members of the community as possible.

Returning to life as we knew it pre pandemic was never going to be easy, but it certainly was something we were all looking forward to. Whilst restrictions were easing, the threat of the virus was still very real and would certainly impact on community sport participation in 2022.

We approached Round One with well over 830 registered teams raring to go, before the heavens opened in NSW like never before. Torrential rain causing severe flooding in our region not only delayed the start of the Football Season, but caused far more serious issues for local community members. Unfortunately, we had not seen the end of it either. Over the course of the season over 2,000mm of rain would fall across our state – approximately four times the yearly average.

Despite the inclement weather challenging us throughout the season, we are proud to have delivered over 2,500

competition matches, included every scheduled M-League match across our four top-flight Leagues, in partnership with the local clubs. We are incredibly fortunate to have such passionate, committed volunteers powering each club and providing opportunities for the community to participate and compete. It is thanks to these members that Football in Macarthur continues to thrive.

As I reflect on the 2022 season, there were certainly many highlights to acknowledge and celebrate:

- The launch of a 12-team Women's M-League competition, in partnership with the Southern Districts Soccer Football Association, in what was one of the most exciting seasons on record. We congratulate both the Liverpool City Robins (Premiers) and the Camden Tigers (Champions) on a remarkable season.
- The introduction of MOJO Sports as the official grassroots coaching app, as an initiative to help support local coaches and raise coaching standards.
- The expansion of the **Macarthur 'SAP' League** and introduction of the M-SAP Cup.
- The launch of our Football for Women and Girls in Macarthur 2022 – 2027 Strategy, setting our agenda as we strive to be the number one sport for women and girls in Macarthur.
- Picton Rangers FC securing \$2.13m to upgrade Fairley Road (Picton Showgrounds), thanks to the NSW Summer Bushfire Recovery Grant.

- Progress being made on the Lynwood Park masterplan, with a WestInvest funding application submitted in partnership with Campbelltown City Council.

- A special night at the 2022 M-League Awards, as we celebrated the very best of Macarthur Football.
 Congratulations to all the award winners on your outstanding season.
- The thousands of smiles as MiniRoos Gala Days returned to conclude the winter season.
- The 2022 Grand Finals Series. We congratulate all clubs that qualified and salute the 45 Championshipwinning teams.
- The **50th anniversary** of Campbelltown Collegians FC.
- The 40th anniversaries for both the Macarthur District Football Referees Association and Eschol Park FC.
- The 20th anniversary of Harrington United FC, a year in which the club saluted their U18 Girls team following a remarkable Champion of Champions victory. We congratulate the team and acknowledge the efforts of the U14 Girls for progress to the Final.
- A historic first title for Macarthur FC, claiming the Australia Cup against Sydney United.
- The Macarthur Rams and Macarthur Rams Women
 FC both adding silverware this season, with
 Championship victories in the NSW League and NPL
 Women's Competitions respectively. We congratulate both clubs and pay tribute to outgoing Chairman
 Rob Laws on a remarkable tenure. Rob is a true champion of the women's game and has served the club with distinction.

SEASON 2022, THE FIRST-YEAR POST COVID WHERE WE LOOKED FORWARD TO A FULL SEASON OF UNINTERRUPTED FOOTBALL...UNFORTUNATELY THE BIG WET HAD OTHER IDEAS!

The ongoing rain and the resultant damage that it caused to grounds played havoc with scheduling during the season. Multiple grounds and fields were severely impacted, with many unable to host many home fixtures, and at least two venues, no matches at all. This meant that games were being moved regularly to try and get them played, and on many occasions the number of reschedules topped 150 matches – each weekend! We thank the Clubs, of which there were multiple, that supported other Clubs in hosting their teams at their venues, many at short notice, and in doing so, ensued that we were able to play as many matches as possible.

A number of competitions did suffer full washout rounds, but those decisions were only made after all efforts to have matches played were exhausted. Some of the lost rounds were fully rescheduled only to see the "catch-up" dates also succumb to wet weather closures. We can assure everyone that many additional hours were worked across the season to try and accommodate the multitude of changes, and whilst ultimately some rounds were lost, this wasn't due to a lack of trying, but purely a lack of venues, and the impacting inclement conditions.

The 2022 season saw the inclusion of teams from the Southern Districts Soccer Football Association (SDSFA) in a couple of our competitions, led by the inclusion of five teams into our Women's M-League competition. Their addition resulted in a 12-team competition, and according to feedback received, was a great success. The ability of the MFA teams to test themselves in competition against our neighbouring Association teams was at the forefront of the positive feedback received, and whilst an SDSFA team (Liverpool City Robins) took out the Premiership (just), Camden Tigers took out the Championship in an absorbing Grand Final, with the Tenealle Hay show on full display.

Harrington United U18 Girls played in the SDSFA U18/21 Women's competition as the MFA was unable to offer a competition specific to that age group, and they did themselves, their Club, and the MFA proud by taking out the Championship and Premiership in that competition.

SDSFA also competed in our combined U16/17 Girls competition with Camden Tigers taking out the Premiership/Championship double in Division 1, winning the Grand Final against Mt Pritchard 4-0.

The Narellan Rangers capped-off a strong M-League Men's campaign, claiming the Premiership in First Grade and the Premiership/Championship double in Reserve Grade. The Camden Tigers came from fourth position to take out the First Grade Championship after an entertaining Grand Final ended in a penalty shootout. Eschol Park took out the Premiership/Championship double in the Colts, in what was a great season for that team.

The Grand Final weekends were highly successful events, and many great matches resulted. We thank Narellan for hosting at Nott Oval and Campbelltown Uniting Church for hosting at Lynwood – positive feedback was received regarding both venues which is a high praise for all the efforts put in by the committees and volunteers at those Clubs. The Division 1 Grand Finals were again played at Lynwood Stadium, and like the two aforementioned venues, positive commentary

was received and we thank the volunteers and staff who assisted at that venue.

As we write this report, all MFA teams are participating in the Champion of Champions tournament, and we are confident that each of the teams will give a great account of themselves against the best the state has to offer.

Despite the wet weather playing havoc with our season, it was disappointing to note that the level of forfeits this season (233 matches) was almost four times that of 2019 (57 forfeits) which was our last full season before COVID disrupted the 2020 (54 forfeits) and 2021 (53 forfeits) seasons. There is no clear explanation as to why there were so many forfeits this season, but the number is extremely disappointing particularly as the season was somewhat compromised with so many washouts.

In season 2022 we welcomed a total of 10,042 players. This total represented the third highest level of registrations in the MFA over the past 20 years.

The breakup of registrations saw:

- MiniRoos: 4,470 (2nd highest number ever)
- Youth: 2,498 (lowest number in 8 years)
- Seniors: 3,074 (3rd highest number ever)
- 2,154 Female players (21% of total registrations)

Across 2022, we ran 105 competitions for 839 teams (female teams representing 17% of this number), which despite the decline in player numbers, represented the third highest number of competitions offered by the Association to date. This shows that our competition offering is broad and takes into account the ever-evolving dynamics of the area and the sport in general.

2022 saw the last year of physical Match Cards as, in 2023, we are finally entering into the digital age and moving to electronic match cards. This is possible through the newly adopted competition management system that will offer a better management process for all Clubs and their members, and to the MFA in providing an efficient way of producing draws and overall competition management.

I take this opportunity to pass on my sincere thanks to the Board of the MFA, the MFA General Manager and MFA staff, plus the hardworking members of the Competitions Management Committee for their unwavering support during this challenging year, and supporting the challenges and difficulties that we faced to continue to provide football despite the inclement weather.

I also wanted to thank all of the MFA member Clubs and their volunteers that make the game happen. The game would not operate without the invaluable support and commitment of these individuals, especially in the year that was 2022.

COACH AND PLAYER DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES CONTINUED TO REACH NEW MILESTONES IN 2022 DESPITE THE WET WEATHER HINDERING SOME OF OUR PLANS.

COACH DEVELOPMENT

The 2022 season saw the MFA have its biggest ever workforce of Community Coach Educators ready to 'flood' the market in pre-season (February – April). Little did we know we would instead be affected by actual floods, eventuating in the postponement and cancellations of various coach education courses throughout the season.

Despite this, we continued to deliver MiniRoos Certificates, Skill Training Certificates, Game Training Certificates, and for the first time host a Community Goalkeeping Course and two Football Australia 'C' Licence Courses.

As the weather continue to affect our ability to deliver as many courses as we wished, we also took to digital platforms to continue coach education.

With so many tools and opportunities for coaches to be supported, the MFA is confident that players and coaches alike will continue to have positive experiences through the world game with the support needed to help develop the next generation of footballers across the Macarthur region.

COMMUNITY COACHING COURSES

Making community coaching courses more accessible has been a focus for the MFA over the past couple of years.

To do this, we have trained and developed coaches from and working in the local areas to be able to deliver more coaching courses in more locations. This has led us to be one of the leading associations in NSW with eight coaches delivering and assisting in the delivery of various community courses in 2022

A total of 13 community coach education courses were delivered in 2022, with 140 coaches completing one or more certificates in 2022.

The MiniRoos Certificate, the introductory coaching course for coaches of U6-U8 teams, continued to be the most sought-after course with 64 coaches completing their certificate across five courses. The MFA would like to thank Oran Park Rovers FC, Ingleburn Eagles Soccer Club, Douglas Park Wilton FC, and Camden Tigers FC for putting their hands up to host a MiniRoos Certificate during the 2022 season.

The MFA also delivered 4 Skill Training Certificates, a coaching course for coaches of children in the Skill Acquisition Phase (SAP) age groups of U8-U12, with 45 coaches, mainly from within our successful M-SAP League, completing their certificate. The MFA would like to thank Camden Falcons FC and Eschol Park FC for offering their home grounds as host locations for these courses although they were affected by the weather.

The Skill Training Certificate was also the first course that we piloted introductory webinars on and have now officially added the hour-long webinar as the first part of the course in order to minimise time away from family and provide coaches the opportunity to be upskilled from the comfort of their home.

Three Game Training Certificates were delivered in 2022 for coaches of youth teams from U12-U18, with Narellan Rangers SC hosting the opening course of the year at Nott Oval.

A total of 24 coaches completed their training with some of these coaches invited to register to the Advanced 'C' Licence at the end of the season as testament to their coaching journey and eagerness to develop themselves and their players.

We were also able to pilot an introductory webinar for the Game Training Certificate on the last course of the year and received positive feedback once again as coaches were appreciative of our effort to make coach education more accessible. We plan on formalising this process in 2023 in order to shorten the face-to-face delivery time of Game Training Certificates.

For the first time, we invited Ken Greenhead, Football NSW Institute Goalkeeper Coach, to deliver a Community Goalkeeping Course. The Community Goalkeeping Course is the perfect starting point for coaches who want to learn about the delivery of goalkeeper sessions that are safe, organised, enjoyable and reflective, whilst being player focused.

We will continue to engage with Ken as part of our longterm strategy to provide more opportunities for players in all positions, like goalkeepers, to receive high quality training and coaching.

2023 will see Macarthur FA take another step forward in making coach education courses more accessible by making all community courses free to locally registered participants (players, coaches, referees and volunteers).

DIGITAL COACH DEVELOPMENT

Further to the online components of the formal learning opportunities mentioned previously, 2022 was the MFA's first year partnering up with MOJO. MOJO is an American organisation offering a free-to-use grassroots coaching app with the aim to "empower players, families and coaches to unlock the magic of youth sports through incredible technology, content and experiences."

The MFA is also the first Australian organisation partnering up with MOJO who have partnerships with the MLS (Major Soccer League in the USA) and FC Barcelona.

We were able to successfully integrate the MOJO content into our formal coach education courses whilst also providing informal learning opportunities throughout the year with coaches able to access a full library of sessions, videos and coaching tips on the one app and the ability to watch three videos in less than ten minutes before their training sessions.

We saw great engagement during pre-season with our presentation to the clubs and the integration of the app into our coach education courses, which led to peak

engagement periods in March, April and May.

By June we had reached more than 250 active users and we are currently sitting on 316 users after our first full season partnering up with MOJO as our Official Grassroots Coaching App.

The MFA also continued its partnership with Sport Session Planner as a digital session planning tool for advanced coaches in the region to assist with their development. Through this partnership we have also engaged with The Coaches Voice, a European based digital coach education platform for advanced coaches, to provide further development opportunities to our MFA Coach Educators.

CLUB COACH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (CCDP) & FEMALE COACH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (FCDP)

The CCDP, formerly known as the CCC Program, saw limited success in the 2022 season due to the inclement weather and lack of training sessions throughout the year.

Despite this, the MFA's CCDP was still successful in 2022 with two workshops and 20 of our 22 local clubs engaging with coach education opportunities throughout the season.

A special mention goes out to the following clubs that were actively engaged with coach education opportunities during the 2022 season through the CCDP: Bradbury Ambarvale FC, Burragorang DSC, Camden Falcons FC, Camden Tigers FC, Douglas Park Wilton FC, Eschol Park FC, Gunners SC, Harrington United FC, Ingleburn SC, Oran Park FC and Picton Rangers FC.

As part of the coach development initiatives in 2022, the MFA launched a Female Coach Development Program (FCDP) with the purpose of supporting current female coaches and encouraging aspiring female volunteers to coach within our local clubs.

The program consists of a female coach's support network, workshops, coaching courses and resources that aim to cater to all coaches involved in the program, regardless of their coaching experience or commitment levels. 2022 saw the successful delivery of a Female Only MiniRoos Certificate and Female Only Skill Training Certificate with 23 female coaches successfully completing their qualification through these opportunities.

FA 'C' LICENCES

For the first time ever, Macarthur FA hosted two Football Australia 'C' Licences in the local region with Ron Dine Memorial Reserve, home of Camden Tigers FC, hosting the pre-season course in February 2022 for 16 participants. Meanwhile, Lynwood Park, home of Macarthur Rams FC and the Macarthur FA, hosted the post-season course in October and November 2022 for 19 participants.

The delivery of these two advanced courses has resulted in 30 new 'C' Licence accredited coaches from our Macarthur region: a huge accomplishment for our community.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Holiday Clinics

Macarthur FA and Macarthur FC continued our partnership to deliver the popular Macarthur FC Bulls Holiday Clinics during the 2023 season.

Clinics were held at Wayne Gardner Reserve, Lynwood Park and Nott Oval in January, April, July and September holiday periods with more than 300 registrations across our Mixed 2-Day Clinics and 1-Day Girls Only Clinics.

The benefits of collaborating with the Macarthur Bulls was evident with all participants receiving a Macarthur FC training kit, Macarthur FC posters and the unique opportunity to meet Macarthur FC players like Lachie Rose and Charles M'Mombwa.

Association Development Program (ADP)

The ADP was delivered again during the season as a 20week program aiming to provide opportunities for local kids aged 5-12 years old to have access to development based supplementary training in a structured environment.

With 147 participants spread out across 3 hubs, the 2022 season was another success in what was a difficult year for training as all clubs can attest to. With Belgenny Reserve flooded and out of action for most of the season, Camden Falcons FC helped the ADP by securing access to Kirkham Park on a Monday night whilst Harrington United FC kindly provided us with access to their training field.

With so many parents and children providing positive feedback, the MFA decided to deliver a 9-week Summer ADP to provide further development opportunities during the off-season from October to December. With 68 registrations at the time of time writing this report, it is evident that the ADP continues to provide the local community with accessible opportunities to development-based training with MFA coaches.

Finally, I would like to thank all the clubs, volunteers, players, coaches, and parents for all their support in 2022. I look forward to a successful 2023 season with the growing M-SAP League and all the previously mentioned initiatives continuing to grow from strength to strength.

We look forward to working with the Bulls in the future to create further lasting memories.

WHAT A YEAR 2022 WAS FOR FOOTBALL IN OUR REGION.

The preseason started late due to lockdowns and COVID-19 restrictions but finally managed to get on the training pitch late November 2021.

We started the preseason with players constantly getting sick with Covid as the pandemic was still hitting Sydneysiders constantly.

Due to restrictions, trials weren't able to run and we found that most clubs were signing players based on video footage.

We set out a plan to recruit local youth players from other NPL clubs by telling them about our vision to make Macarthur Rams great again by engaging the local community and clubs.

We managed to upset a few NPL1 and NPL2 Youth teams in our trials by playing a beautiful brand of football.

In February, we entered the Bathurst Cup and managed to get all our teams out of the group stages and into the quarter finals. Our 16s lost to eventual winners Blacktown Spartans.

The 2022 NPL3 Youth commenced and we started very strongly, sitting first in the Club Championship for 18 weeks out of 30.

As the season progressed into the final 10 weeks, a couple of our youth teams started to struggle with injuries, covid and other situations. This put the program into a very tight position as we had numerous players playing two games to cover. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be this year for youth, we will be back next year bigger and better and push for that promotion into NPL2 Youth. On the bright side, we still had three teams from five make semi-finals. Our youth for 2022 was made up of 96.2% local players.

The Seniors went through a full re-build, with our head coach Brett Hewit getting to work early and approaching a young batch of players from numerous NPL1 20s teams. At the start of the season, we had 16 new faces in our first-grade squad with an average age of 21. We noticed early on in the season that the younger players mixed with our more experienced players was a perfect match. We won some matches against competition heavyweights with our never say die attitude. We finished fifth in the competition and qualified for the finals series for the first time since 2014. In order to make the Grand Final, we needed to win four in a row and we achieved that by knocking out the teams that had finished above us in the league. We faced Inter Lions FC in the Final at Sydney United's home ground. Our team won 2-1 against the competition favourites. As the Chair, I was so proud to see so many local Macarthur supporters there on the day and I still believe that they were the ones that got us over the line that day.

Our SAP had an outstanding year. The U9 were predominantly local players from the under 8s M-SAP competition.

I instructed our U9 coaches to attend these matches during the year and identify the best talent available. We continued to develop our SAP kids under the guidance of ex Socceroo Brett Emerton. We will continue to develop our kids from the region to become the best footballers they can be in the future. This will ensure that we will have a vast talent pool for all NPL clubs and MFA AYL when they go into the youth system.

Our local SAP sat at 98% local talent in 2022.

FOLLOWING A DISRUPTED TWO SEASONS WITH COVID ETC, 2022 SAW A RETURN TO A WELL PERFORMED AND SUCCESSFUL MACARTHUR RAMS WOMENS FC.

Topping off the season saw our first grade Rams win the grand final over Northern Tigers in one of the best NPL matches on display. This win now records Macarthur Rams as having the unprecedented record of winning five championships since the inception of the National Premier League. What a record and congratulations to players and coaching staff for a tremendous commitment to our club.

Coaches Stephen Peters and Peter Nowakowski showed what professionals they are in preparing the first and reserve squads who worked together from pre season and leading them towards their final achievements for the year.

The grand final win was a fitting finale for our stalwart player, Kylie Ledbrook (Matilda # 130) who retired after the match. Kylie has a remarkable football record including sixteen seasons with Macarthur Rams, together with an outstanding international and W League career. The testimonial dinner for Kylie Ledbrook and Leena Khamis who have a combined service of thirty eight years with Macarthur Rams was a highlight of this year's calendar. Presentations from previous Matilda coaches Alen Stajcic and Tom Sermanni highlighted

how much Kylie and Leena are held in high esteem and acknowledged their contribution to football and especially Macarthur Rams.

The accomplishments of our senior squads should not be under estimated and put us in an enviable position to take football forward yet again in the Macarthur area.

Participation in the National Premier League Women's competitions also involves the extremely important youth program, which includes Under 14, Under 15, Under 16 and the newly introduced Under 18 teams.

On a continual basis, the standard of paly continues to excel on a technical, speed of play and physical attributes basis. This season was no exception and was especially competitive and a tough ask for Macarthur Rams with the teams being tested week in and week out.

Our Under 14 and Under 15 squads largely developed from the GSAP curriculum which assisted but performances still showed how much still needs to be done to stay competitive within the league. Although not amongst the leaders ladder wise in the competition, we were able to introduce these teams to the culture and way at Rams with an aim of lifting technical and physiological attributes for their future in the game.

The Under 16 and Under 18 teams were always aware of how intense their respective competitions were going to play out during the season. With both squads undergoing a rebuild of sorts, there was the need to fast track as much as possible a skill set needed to compete at NPL level. To this, team coaches Nathan Randall and Carlos Guardado must be congratulated for the manner in which they prepared, guided and advised their respective players on what is required from them.

The support of all MFA member clubs in the development of their young female players is welcomed by Macarthur Rams and you should all be especially proud of the contribution made to your players football development.

Girls Skill Acquisition Program (GSAP) saw another successful season for Macarthur Rams. The program consists of four teams – U10 through to U13 using a smaller field and player roster and is considered as a preparation for NPL beginning at U14.

Macarthur Rams GSAP is comprised totally of players from local Macarthur community clubs. Womens football is rapidly gaining momentum in the lead up to the 2023 World Cup to be hosted in Australia and Macarthur Rams Womens FC is at the forefront of young girl's football development.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales and Class Order 11/01. In the opinion of the Management Group the association is not a reporting entity because it is not reasonable to expect the existence of users who rely on the association's general purpose financial statements for information useful to them for making and evaluating decisions about the allocation of resources.

The association has not assessed whether these special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Accounts Receivables and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members and customers for goods sold and services performed in the ordinary course of operations. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

PPE are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Income Tax

The Management Group are of the opinion that the Association is exempt from Income Tax under the provisions of Section 50.45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 and consequently no provision for taxation has been raised in the financial statements.

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed.

Interest revenue is recognised when received.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the Association obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt. Where the terms of the Grant or donation prescribe specific performance obligations, income is recognised when the performance obligations are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable.

(h) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability and is subject to normal credit terms (30-60 days). The balance is not interest-bearing.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Macarthur Football Association Inc., which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 June 2022, the profit and loss statement for the year ended on that date, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the statement by Members of the Management Group.

We are independent of the association in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist Macarthur Football Association Inc. to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the constitution and Associations Incorporation Act. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the association to cease to continue as a going concern
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation
